Caring for Your c580

Your c580 contains sensitive electronic components that can be permanently damaged if exposed to excessive shock or vibration. To minimize the risk of damage to your c580, avoid dropping your unit and operating it in high-shock and high-vibration environments.

Cleaning the Unit

The c580 is constructed of high-quality materials and does not require user maintenance other than cleaning. Clean the unit's outer casing (not the touch screen) using a cloth dampened with a mild detergent solution, and then wipe dry. Avoid chemical cleaners and solvents that can damage plastic components.

Cleaning the Touch Screen

Clean the touch screen with a soft, clean, lint-free cloth. Use water, isopropyl alcohol, or eyeglass cleaner, if needed. Apply the liquid to the cloth, and then gently wipe the touch screen.

Protecting Your c580

- Do not store the c580 where prolonged exposure to extreme temperatures can occur (such as in the trunk of a car), because it can cause permanent damage.
- Do not expose the c580 to water. Contact with water can cause this unit to malfunction.
- Though a PDA stylus can also be used to operate the touch screen, never attempt this while operating a vehicle. Never use a hard or sharp object to operate the touch screen or damage may result.

Avoiding Theft

- To avoid theft, remove the unit and mount from sight when not in use. Remove the residue on the windshield left by the suction cup.
- Do not keep your unit in the glove compartment; thieves know where to look.

GETTING STARTED

What's in the Box?

c580 unit and vehicle suction cup mount.

Vehicle power cable with built-in MSN® Direct Receiver to provide external power and MSN Direct content.

USB cable to connect the c580 to your computer. Your c580 connects to your computer as a Mass Storage Device (see [pages 23–24](#)).

Dashboard Disk to mount the suction cup mount on your dashboard (see [page 34](#)).

Looking at Your c580



Step 1: Mount the c580

Select a suitable location to mount the c580 on your windshield. Clean and dry the selected area of your windshield.



1. Plug the vehicle power cable into the power connector on the back of the c580.
2. Place the suction cup on the windshield. Flip the lever back, toward the windshield.
3. Snap the socket on the back of the c580 onto the ball on the end of the suction cup mount.
4. Plug the other end of the vehicle power cable into a power outlet in your vehicle. The green LED on the vehicle power cable lights when connected to power. Your unit should turn on automatically if it is plugged in and your vehicle is running.

To remove the c580 from the mount, turn the c580 as far as you can to the right or left. Apply pressure in that direction until the c580 snaps off the mount.



To remove the suction cup mount from the windshield, flip the lever toward you. Pull the tab on the suction cup toward you.

Step 2: Configure the c580

To turn on your c580, press and hold the  **Power** button on the side of the unit. Follow the on-screen instructions to configure your c580.

Step 3: Acquire Satellites

Go outdoors to an open area, away from tall buildings and trees. Turn on the c580. Acquiring satellite signals may take a few minutes.

When the c580 has acquired satellite signals, the satellite signal strength bars on the in the upper-left corner of the Menu page are green . When it loses satellite signals, the bars turn red or hollow .

Step 4: Use the c580

- A** Touch to find a destination.
- B** Touch to view the map.
- C** Touch to make a call (when connected to a [compatible mobile phone](#) with Bluetooth® wireless technology).
- D** Touch to open the MSN® Direct menu, when the MSN Direct Receiver is connected.
- E** Touch to listen to MP3 files loaded on the SD card or c580 drive.
- F** Touch to adjust the c580's settings.
- G** Touch to adjust the brightness of the screen.

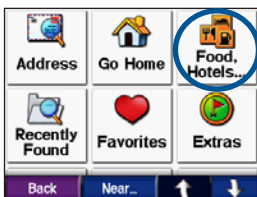


Finding Your Destination

The Where to menu provides several different categories for you to use when you search for locations.



1 Touch **Where to**.



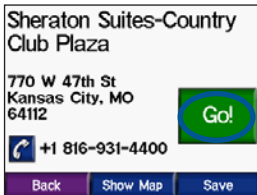
2 Select a category.



3 Select a sub-category.



4 Select a destination.



5 Touch **Go**.



6 Enjoy the route!


TIP: Touch  and  to see more choices.

Following Your Route

After you touch Go, the Map page opens with your route marked with a magenta line. As you travel, your c580 guides you to your destination with voice prompts, arrows on the map, and directions at the top of the Map page. A checkered flag marks your destination. If you depart from the original route, your c580 recalculates the route and provides new directions.

Adding a Stop to Your Route

You can add one stop to your route. The c580 gives you directions to the stop and then to your final destination.

1. With a route active, touch **Menu** on the Map page.
2. Touch  **Where to**, and then search for the extra stop.
3. Touch **Go**.
4. Touch **Yes** to add this stop before your destination. Or, touch **No** to make this your new final destination.

Taking a Detour

If a road on your route is closed, you can take a detour.

1. With a route active, touch **Menu**.
2. Touch **Detour**.

The c580 attempts to get you back on your original route, as soon as possible. If the route you are currently taking is the only reasonable option, the c580 might not calculate a detour.


Stopping the Route

1. With a route active, touch **Menu**.
2. Touch **Stop**.



Adjusting the Volume

Turn the volume knob on the right side of the unit to adjust the master volume level. To adjust the volume levels, see [page 30](#).

Adjusting the Brightness

On the Menu page, touch . Touch **-** to lower the brightness and **+** to raise it. Touch **OK** when you are done.

Locking Your c580

1. On the Menu page, touch  >  **System**.
2. Touch the button next to **Garmin Lock**. Touch **OK**.
3. Enter a 4-digit PIN. Touch **Yes** to accept the PIN.
4. Touch **OK**. Drive to a security location, and touch **Set**.

Each time you turn on the c580, enter the PIN or drive to the security location.

What is a Security Location?

You can select any location, such as your home or office, for your security location. If you are at your security location and your c580 has acquired satellite signals, you do not need to enter the 4-digit PIN.



NOTE: If you forget your PIN and your security location, you must send your c580 to Garmin to get your unlocked. You must also send a valid product registration or proof of purchase.

Ways to Charge the c580

- Connect the vehicle power cable to the c580 and a power outlet in your vehicle. You may need to start your vehicle.
- Connect the USB cable to the c580 and your computer.
- Connect an optional AC adapter to a wall outlet and the power connector on the back of the c580. Purchase accessories at <http://shop.garmin.com> or contact your Garmin Dealer.



Activating Your MSN® Direct Receiver

To receive MSN Direct content, first you must activate your service (1-year free service included). See [page 19](#) for specific information on activating the service.

WHERE TO

The Where to menu provides several different categories you can use to search for locations. To learn how to perform a simple search, see [page 4](#).

Finding an Address

1. On the Menu page, touch  **Where to** >  **Address**.
2. Select a country and state/province, if necessary.
3. Touch **Spell City**. Enter the city, and touch **Done**.
4. Select the city in the list.
5. Enter the number of the address, and touch **Done**.
6. Enter the street name, and touch **Done**.
7. Select the correct street in the list.
8. Touch the address, if necessary. Touch **Go** to create a route to this address.

Search Tips

- Touch **Near** to change the search area; see [page 11](#).
- You can search for a postal code. Enter the postal code instead of the city name. (Not all map data provides postal code searching.)

Go Page Options

Touch an item in the search results list to view the Go page.


Touch **Go** to create a turn-by-turn route to this location.



Touch **Show Map** to view



this location on the map. If the GPS is off, touch **Set Loc** to select this place as your current location.

Touch **Save** to save this location as one of your Favorites. See [page 10](#).

If a mobile phone with Bluetooth wireless technology is connected, touch  to call this location.

Go Home

You can set a home location for the place you return to most often.

1. On the Menu page, touch  **Where to** >  **Go Home**.
2. Select an option.


Going Home

After you set your home location, you can route to it at any time by touching

 **Where to** >  **Go Home**.



Changing Your Home Location

To change your home location, you must first delete it from **Favorites**:

1. On the Menu page, touch  **Where to** >  **Favorites**.
2. Touch **Home** > **Edit** > **Delete** > **Yes**.



After you delete your home location, reset it by following the steps in the “Go Home” section above.

Finding Points of Interest

1. On the Menu page, touch  **Where to** >  **Food, Hotels**.
2. Select a category and a sub-category, if necessary. (Touch the arrows to see more categories.)
3. Select a destination.
4. Touch **Go**.

Finding a Place by Spelling the Name

If you know the name of the location you are looking for, you can spell it using the on-screen keyboard. You can also enter letters contained in the name to narrow the search.



1. On the Menu page, touch  **Where to** >  **Food, Hotels**.
2. Touch **Spell Name**.
3. Using the on-screen keyboard, enter letters in the name. Touch **Done**.
4. Touch the place you are looking for, and touch **Go**.


Using the On-Screen Keyboard

When an on-screen keyboard appears, touch a letter or number to enter it. Use the keyboard to spell words just like computer keyboard.




Touch  to enter numbers.

Touch  to delete the last character entered; touch and hold  to delete the entire entry.

Touch  to change the keyboard mode to use diacritical characters or special characters.

Finding Recently Found Places

Your c580 stores the last 50 of your recent finds in the Recently Found list. The most recently viewed places appear at the top of the list. On the Menu page, touch  **Where to** >

 **Recently Found** to view your recently found items.

Deleting Recently Found Places

To remove all places from the Recently Found list, touch **Clear**. Then touch **Yes**.




NOTE: When you touch **Clear**, all items from the list are removed. It does not delete the actual place from your unit.



Favorites

You can save places in your Favorites, so you can quickly find them and create routes to them. Your home location is also stored in Favorites.


Saving Places You Find

1. After you have found a place you want to save, touch **Save**.
2. Touch **OK**. The place is saved in  **Favorites**.



Finding Saved Places

1. On the Menu page, touch  **Where to**.
2. Touch  **Favorites**. Your saved locations are listed.

Saving Your Current Location

From the Map page, touch the  vehicle icon. Touch **Yes** to save your current location.


Editing Saved Places

1. On the Menu page, touch  **Where to** >  **Favorites**.
2. Touch the location you want to edit.
3. Touch **Edit**.





4. Touch a button to edit the location:
 - Touch **Change Name**. Enter a new name, and touch **Done**.
 - Touch **Change Map Symbol**. Touch a new symbol.
 - Touch **Change Phone Number**. Enter a phone number, and touch **Done**.
 - Touch **Delete** to remove this item from the Favorites list. Touch **Yes**.





Finding MSN® Direct Locations

To navigate to gas stations and movie theaters with MSN Direct content, touch  **Where to** > **MSN Direct**. For more information, see [pages 19–22](#).

Finding a Place Using the Map

Use the Browse Map page to view different parts of the map. Touch  **Where to** >  **Browse Map**.


Tips for Browsing the Map

- Touch the map and drag to view different parts of the map.
- Touch  and  to zoom in and out.
- Touch any object on the map. An arrow appears pointing at the object you selected.
- Touch **Save** to save this location to your **Favorites**.
- If the GPS Mode is off (touch  >  **System** > **GPS Mode** > **GPS Off**), touch **Set Loc** to set your

location to the selected location.

- Touch **Go** to navigate to the selected location.
- Touch **Back** to return to the previous screen.

Changing the Search Area


1. On the Menu page, touch  **Where to** > **Near**.
2. Select an option:
 - **Where I Am Now**—search for places near your current location.
 - **A Different City**—search for places near the city you enter.
 - **My Current Route**—search for places along the route you are currently navigating.
 - **My Destination**—search for places near your destination.
3. Touch **OK**.



NOTE: Your c580 automatically searches for places near your current location.

USING THE MAIN PAGES

Map Page

On the Menu page, touch  **View map** to open the Map page. The  vehicle icon shows your current location.

To save your current location, touch the vehicle icon, and touch **Yes**.

Touch the text bar to open the Turn List page.

Touch  to zoom out.

Touch  to zoom in.

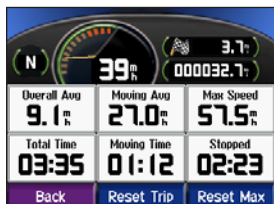
Touch **Menu** to return to the Menu page.

Touch **Arrival or Speed** to open the Trip Information page.

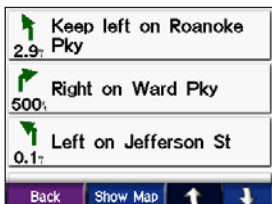
Touch **Turn In** to open the Next Turn page.



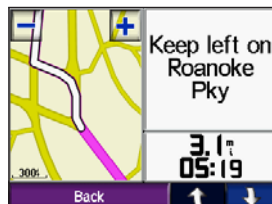
Map Page while Navigating a Route

Trip Information Page

The Trip Information page displays your current speed and provides helpful statistics about your trip. To view the Trip Information page, touch the **Speed** or **Arrival** field on the Map page.

Resetting Trip Information

If you want accurate trip information, reset the trip information before beginning a trip. If you make frequent stops, leave the c580 turned on so it can accurately measure elapsed time during the trip.



Touch **Reset Trip** to reset the information on the Trip Information page. Touch **Reset Max** to reset the maximum speed.

Turn List Page

When you are navigating a route, the Turn List page displays turn-by-turn instructions for your entire route and the distance between turns. Touch the green text bar on the top of the Map page to open the Turn List page. Touch a turn on the list to view the Next Turn page for that turn. Touch **Show Map** to view the entire route on the Browse Map.

Next Turn Page

When you are navigating a route, the Next Turn page shows the turn on the map and the distance and time left before you reach the turn. To view an upcoming turn on the map, touch the **Turn In** field on the Map page, or touch any turn from the Turn List page.

Touch  and  to view other turns in the route. When you are finished viewing the Next Turn page, touch **Back**.

USING HANDS-FREE FEATURES

Using Bluetooth® wireless technology, your c580 can connect to your mobile phone and become a hands-free device. To see if your phone with Bluetooth technology is compatible with the c580, visit www.garmin.com/bluetooth.

Understanding Bluetooth Technology

Bluetooth® wireless technology establishes a wireless link between two devices, such as your phone and the c580. The first time you use two devices together you must “pair” them by establishing a relationship using a PIN/passkey. After the initial pairing, the two devices can connect automatically each time you turn them on.



NOTE: You might have to set your phone to connect automatically when the c580 is turned on.

Pairing Your Phone


To pair and connect, your phone and the c580 must be turned on and be within 10 meters of each other.

Initiate pairing from your c580 or from your phone. Refer to your phone’s documentation.


To pair using the phone settings:

1. Enable the phone’s Bluetooth component. This might be in a menu called Settings, Bluetooth, Connections, or Hands-free.
2. Initiate a search for Bluetooth devices. This might be located in a menu called Bluetooth, Connections, or Hands-free.
3. Select the StreetPilot c580 from the list of devices.
4. Enter the c580’s Bluetooth PIN (**1234**) into your phone.
5. On the c580, touch and hold **Back** to return to the Menu page.

To pair using the c580 settings:

1. On the Menu page, touch  > **Bluetooth**.
2. Touch the **Add** button next to the “Connections” heading.
3. Enable your phone’s Bluetooth component and enable Find Me/ Discoverable/Visible mode. These settings might be in a Bluetooth, Connections, or Hands-free menu.
4. Touch **OK** on the c580.
5. Select your phone, and touch **OK**.
6. Enter the c580’s Bluetooth PIN (**1234**) in your phone.

When your phone is connected to your c580, you are ready to make phone calls.

Touch  to access the Phone menu.

When you turn on the c580, it tries to connect to the last phone to which it was connected.



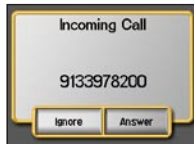
NOTE: Not all phones support all features of the c580 Phone Menu.

Getting a Call

When you get a call, the Incoming Call window opens.



Touch **Answer** to answer the call.

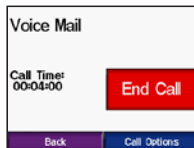
Touch **Ignore** to ignore the call and stop the phone from ringing.



The internal microphone is in the front of the c580; speak normally. Adjust the volume using the volume knob.

In a Call

After you have made or answered a call, the  **In Call** icon appears. Touch  to open the In Call page.



Touch **End Call** to hang up. Touch **Call Options** for the following options:

- **Touch Tones**—displays a keypad page so you can use automated systems, such as voice mail.

- **Transfer Audio To Phone**—switch audio to your phone. This is helpful if you plan to turn off the c580, but want to stay on the call or if you need privacy. To switch back, touch **Transfer Audio To Device**.
- **Mute Microphone**—mute the microphone.

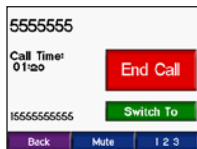
Using Call Waiting

When you are on a call and you receive a second call (call waiting), the c580 displays the Incoming Call window.

Touch **Answer** to answer the call. The first call is placed on hold.


To switch between calls:

1. Touch  to open the In Call menu.



2. Touch **Switch To**.
3. Touch **End Call** to hang up; this does not disconnect the call on hold.

Phone Menu



On the Menu page, touch  to open the Phone menu. Press **Status** to view the connected phone's signal strength, battery level, and name.






NOTE: Not all phones support all features of the c580 Phone Menu.

Using Your Phone Book

It may take a few minutes for your phone book to be available.



1. On the Menu page, touch .
2. Touch  **Phone Book**.
3. Touch the phone book entry (contact) you want to call.
4. Touch **Dial** to call the contact, or touch **Compose** to send an SMS/text message.

Dialing a Point of Interest

1. On the Menu page, touch .
2. Touch  **Food, Hotels.**
3. Search for the location you want to call. Open the Go page.
4. Touch **Dial** or .





Dialing a Number

1. On the Menu page, touch .
2. Touch  **Dial.**
3. Enter the number, and touch **Dial.**

Viewing Your Call History



Each time your phone connects to the c580, your call history is automatically transferred to the c580. It may take a few minutes to transfer this data to the c580.

1. On the Menu page, touch .
2. Touch  **Call History.**
3. Touch **Missed, Dialed,** or **Received.**
4. The most recent calls are at the top. Touch a number to call to it.



Calling Home

Enter a phone number for your home location, so you can quickly call home.

Entering Your Home Location and Phone Number



1. On the Menu page, touch .
2. Touch  **Call Home.**
3. If you have not set your home location ([page 8](#)), follow the prompts to set your home location. Touch **Save.**
4. Touch **Yes** to enter a phone number.
5. Enter the phone number, and then touch **Done.** The c580 dials your home phone number.

Calling Your Home

1. On the Menu page, touch .
2. Touch  **Call Home.**
3. The c580 dials your home phone number.

Placing Calls Using Voice Dial

You can place calls by speaking the contact's name.

1. On the Menu page, touch .
2. Touch  **Voice Dial**.
3. Speak the contact name.



NOTE: You may need to “train” your mobile phone to recognize your voice commands. Refer to your phone’s documentation.



Using SMS/Text Messaging

If your phone supports SMS/text messaging using Bluetooth technology, you can send and receive text messages on the c580.

Getting a Text Message

When you get a text message, the Incoming Text window opens. Touch **Listen** to play the text message, **Review** to open your inbox, or **Ignore** to close the window.




Sending a Text Message

1. On the Menu page, touch .
2. Touch  **Text Message**.
3. Touch **Compose**.
4. Select an option to select the text message recipient.
5. Enter the message, and touch **Done**.



NOTE: Messages sent from your c580 do not appear in your phone’s outbox.

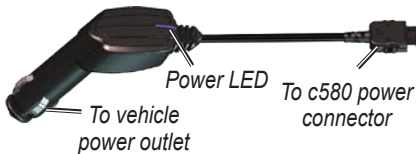

USING MSN® DIRECT

The MSN Direct Receiver, which is integrated in the vehicle power cable, receives MSN Direct content such as traffic, weather, gas prices, and movie times. For more information about MSN Direct, see <http://garmin.msndirect.com>.




The MSN Direct Receiver and c580 must be in range of an MSN Direct coverage area. For coverage areas, see <http://garmin.msndirect.com/coverage>.

Your c580 must be connected to the MSN Direct Receiver (vehicle power cable) to receive MSN Direct content.



Activating Your MSN Direct Receiver

To receive MSN Direct content, first you must activate your service (1-year free service included).

1. Connect the vehicle power cable to your c580 and your vehicle's power outlet. Turn your vehicle's key to the ON/ACC position, if necessary, to power the c580.
2. On the Menu page, touch .
3. Write down the product key.
4. Call (866) 658.7032 or go to <http://garmin.msndirect.com/activate> and follow the directions.
5. Within two days of completing step 4 above, complete the following steps:
 - Connect the vehicle power cable, and turn the key to ON/ACC.
 - Make sure that you are in a coverage area.
 - On the Menu page, touch . If the Subscription Inactive page appears, verify that at least one signal bar in the upper right corner is green . It may take up to 20 minutes for your subscription to be activated. After it is activated, the MSN Direct Menu (see [page 20](#)) is accessible.

Receiving Content



It can take several hours to receive all the content the first time you use it, after you have traveled long distances, or after you have not used your c580 and MSN® Direct Receiver for several days.

There is a (non-user replaceable) rechargeable battery in the MSN Direct Receiver that allows it to receive and store updates for several days, even when not connected to external power.

MSN Direct Menu

On the Menu page, touch . If your subscription is inactive, see [page 19](#). If  appears, you are not in a coverage area or you may be in a signal shadow.


Touch **Service Status** to view the MSN Direct signal strength and battery level. Touch **Subscription** for instructions on how to renew your MSN Direct service (1-year free service included).



Traffic Information

To view traffic in your area, on the Menu page, touch  > **Traffic**. Touch **Details** to view details of the traffic delays.


Traffic on Your Road

When you are not navigating a route and there is a traffic delay on the road you are driving on, the Map page displays a traffic icon, such as . See the list of icons on the next page. Touch the icon to view information about the traffic delays on the road ahead.


Traffic on Your Route

When calculating your route, the c580 examines the current traffic delays and automatically optimizes the route for the shortest time. You might still be routed through traffic if it is the best route

available or no alternative roads exist. If a severe traffic delay occurs on your route while you are navigating, the c580 automatically recalculates the route to avoid the severe delay.








The Map page displays  when there is a traffic delay on your route. The number in the icon represents the time this delay added to your route. The delay time has been automatically calculated into the arrival time shown on the map.

To avoid traffic on your route:

1. On the Map page, touch .
2. Touch the text bar for more information. If there is more than one delay, touch **Details**.
3. Touch **Avoid** to avoid this delay.

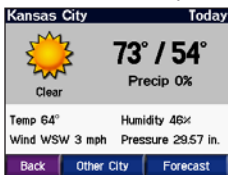

2. The gas stations nearest you are listed. Prices in green are considered low prices; red prices are high. Touch a gas station to view details.
3. Touch **Go** to navigate to this location.

Movie Times



NOTE: It can take up to 6 hours to download movie information for your area the first time you use the MSN Direct Receiver, after you have traveled long distances, and after you have not used the MSN Direct Receiver for several days.

1. On the Menu page, touch  > **Movie Times**.
2. Select how you want to search for the movie (by title or by theater).
3. Current movies/nearby theaters are listed.
4. Touch the movie title or theater.
5. Touch the theater or movie title.
5. Movie times and theater information are listed. Touch **Go** to navigate to this location.

Loading Files

To insert or remove the card, press it in until it clicks.



Step 2: Connect the USB Cable

Connect the mini-USB connector to the side of the c580. Connect the larger end of the cable to an available USB port on your computer.



Your c580 and SD card appear as removable drives in My Computer on Windows computers, and as mounted volumes on Mac® computers.





NOTE: On some operating systems or computers with multiple network drives, the c580 drives may not be displayed. See your operating system's Help file to learn how to map the drives.

Step 3: Transfer Files to Your c580

Copy and paste files from your computer into the c580 drives/volumes.

1. Browse your computer for the file you want to copy.
2. Highlight the file, and select **Edit** > **Copy**.
3. Open the “Garmin” drive or the SD card drive.
4. Select **Edit** > **Paste**. The file appears in the list of files on the c580 memory or SD card.

Step 4: Eject and Unplug the USB Cable

When you are finished transferring files, click the **Eject**  icon in your system tray, or drag the volume icon to the **Trash**  on Mac computers. Unplug your c580 from your computer.

Deleting Files





4. Touch a playlist to start playing the MP3 files. You cannot change the playlist order from your c580.

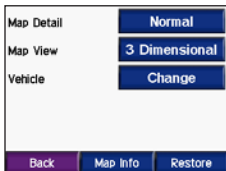

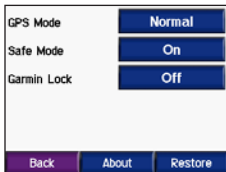

About—display your c580’s software version number, unit ID number, and audio version number. You need this information when you update the system software (see [page 31](#)) or purchase additional map data (see [page 33](#)).

Restore—restore the system settings.

Localizing Your c580


On the Menu page, touch  >  **Locale.**





To change a setting, touch the button next to the icon.

To change all settings, touch **Change All**. In each screen, touch the button next to the setting you want, and then touch **Next**.

Locale—select your location.

 **Text Language**—change all on-screen text to the selected language. Changing the text language does not change the language of user-entered data or map data, such as street names.

 **Voice Language**—change the language for voice prompts. Languages noted with a person's name are text-to-speech (TTS) voices, which have an extensive vocabulary and pronounce the street names as you approach turns. The pre-recorded voices (those without a person's name) have a limited vocabulary and do not speak names of locations or streets.



 **Time Format**—choose a 12-hour, 24-hour, or UTC time format.

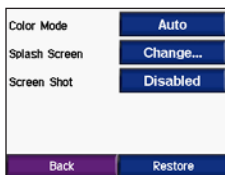
Time Zone—select a time zone or nearby city from the list.

Daylight Saving—set to **On**, **Off**, or **Auto**, if it is available.

 **Units**—change units of measure to **Kilometers** or **Miles**.


Customizing the Display

On the Menu page, touch  >  **Display**.




Color Mode—select **Daytime** for a light background, **Nighttime** for a dark background, or **Auto** to automatically switch between the two.

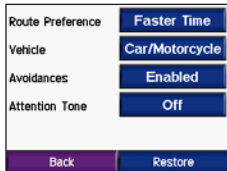
Splash Screen—select an image to be shown when you turn on the c580. First, load JPEG images. See [pages 23–24](#).

Screen Shot—enable Screen Shot mode. Touch the  camera icon to take a picture of the screen. The picture bitmap file is saved in the **Garmin\scrn** folder on the c580 drive.

Changing the Navigation Settings

On the Menu page, touch  >

 **Navigation.**



Route Preference—select a preference for calculating your route. Select **Faster Time** to calculate routes that are faster to drive but can be longer in distance. Select **Shorter Distance** to calculate routes that are shorter in distance but can take more time to drive.


Vehicle Type—specify your vehicle type to optimize routes.

Avoidances—select (place a check mark by) the road types you want to avoid on your routes. The c580 uses these road types only if alternative routes take you too far out of your way or if no other roads are available. If you have a MSN[®] Direct Receiver connected, you can also avoid traffic delays.

Attention Tone—turn on or off the attention tone.

Restore—restore the original navigation settings.

Bluetooth Technology Settings

On the Menu page, touch  >

 **Bluetooth.**


Connections—select a device to connect to. Select **Add Device** to pair with a mobile phone that has Bluetooth[®] wireless technology. See [pages 14–17](#). Touch **Change** if you want to connect to a different phone in the list. Select your phone, and touch **OK**.



NOTE: The c580's PIN code (or passkey) is **1234**.

Drop—select the phone you want to disconnect, and touch **Yes**.





Remove—select the phone you want to delete from the c580's memory, and touch **Yes**.

Bluetooth—enable and disable the Bluetooth component. The  **Bluetooth** icon appears on the Menu page if the Bluetooth component is enabled. To prevent a phone from automatically connecting, select **Disabled**.

Troubleshoot—scroll through the list containing compatible devices. If your phone is not in this list, go to www.garmin.com/bluetooth for more information.

Restore—restore the original Bluetooth settings. This will not clear the pairing information.

Adjusting the Volume Levels

Turn the volume knob on the right side of the unit to adjust the master volume level. To adjust the volume levels for the MP3 player and navigation prompts, on the Menu page, touch  >  **Volume**. Touch  and .

Restoring All Settings

Clearing User Data



CAUTION: This deletes all user-entered information.

1. Hold your finger on the lower-right corner of the c580's screen while turning on the c580.
2. Keep your finger pressed until the pop-up window appears.

All original settings are restored. Any items that you have saved are erased.

With the SaversGuide preprogrammed SD data card and membership card, your c580 becomes a digital coupon book that notifies you of merchants near your current location where you are eligible for a discount, such as restaurants, hotels, movie theaters, and auto repair shops.

Safety Cameras

Safety camera information is available in some locations. Check <http://my.garmin.com> for availability. For these locations, the c580 includes the locations of hundreds of safety cameras. Your c580 alerts you when you are approaching a safety camera and can warn you if you are driving too fast. The data is updated at least weekly, so you always have access to the most up-to-date information.



You can purchase a new region or extend an existing subscription at any time. Each region that you purchase has its own expiration date.



Custom POIs (Points of Interest)

Load custom points of interest (POIs) onto your c580. POI databases are available from various companies on the Internet. Some custom databases contain alert information for points, such as safety cameras and school zones. You will receive a warning if you are

traveling too fast near these custom POIs.

Download the POI Loader at www.garmin.com/extras, and click **POI Loader**. Refer to the POI Loader Help file; press F1 to open the Help file.

To view your Custom POIs, touch  **Where to** >  **Extras** > **Custom POIs**.

To change the proximity alert settings, touch  >  **Proximity Points** > **Proximity Alerts**. Turn on or off the alerts when you approach Custom POIs.

To delete the Custom POIs from your c580, connect your c580 to your computer. Open the **Garmin\poi** folder in the c580 drive or the SD card drive. Delete the file entitled **poi.gpi**.

Garmin TourGuide™

To change the Garmin TourGuide settings, touch  >  **Proximity Points** > **TourGuide**. Select **Auto Play** to hear the complete tour as programmed, **Prompted** to show the speaker icon  on the map when tour information is available during your route, or **Off**.

Additional Maps

You can purchase additional MapSource map data from Garmin and load the maps on your c580's internal memory or on an optional SD card.

To find out the version of the maps that are loaded on your c580, open the Menu page. Touch  >  **Map** > **Map Info**. To enable additional maps, you need your unit ID (see [page 27](#)) and serial number (located near the power connector).

To load maps or waypoints to your c580 memory or SD card, select the name for your c580 drive or SD card drive. Refer to the MapSource Help file for more information about using MapSource and loading maps and waypoints on your c580.




Battery Information

Your unit contains an internal (non-removable) lithium-ion battery. The battery should last up to 8 hours, depending on usage.

The  battery icon in the corner of the Menu page indicates the status of the internal battery. If the icon is not present, the c580 is connected to external power.

Contact your local waste disposal department for information on properly disposing of the unit.

Maximizing the Battery Life

- Turn off GPS Mode  >  > **GPS Mode** > **GPS Off** when you do not need to receive GPS signals, or use **Normal** mode when you do not need to use WAAS or EGNOS.
- Turn the backlight brightness down (on the Menu page, touch ).
- Do not leave your c580 in direct sunlight. Avoid prolonged exposure to excessive heat.

Mounting on Your Dashboard

Use the enclosed mounting disk to mount your unit to the dashboard and comply with certain state regulations.




CAUTION: The permanent mounting adhesive is extremely difficult to remove after it is installed.

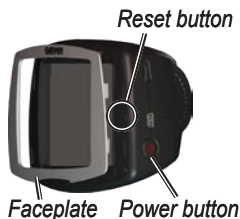
1. Clean and dry the dashboard where you are placing the disk.
2. Remove the backing from the permanent mounting adhesive on the bottom of the disk.
3. Place the disk on the dashboard.
4. Remove the clear plastic cover from the top of the disk.
5. Place the suction cup mount on top of the disk. Flip the lever down (toward the disk).



Resetting Your c580

If your unit locks up (freezes up), press and hold the  **Power** button to turn off the unit. Then turn the unit back on. If this does not help, reset your c580.

1. Place your thumb nail in the groove located under the Garmin logo on the faceplate.



2. Gently pull off the faceplate.
3. Press the **Reset** button.
4. Connect the c580 to an external power source. The c580 should automatically turn back on and operate normally.



NOTE: If you need to reset your unit often, update the system software. See [page 31](#) for information about updating the software.

Changing the Fuse



CAUTION: When replacing the fuse, do not lose any of the small pieces and make sure they are put back in the proper place.

If your unit will not charge in your vehicle, you may need to replace the fuse located at the tip of the vehicle adapter.

1. Unscrew the black (or silver), round end piece and remove it.
2. Remove the fuse (glass and silver cylinder) and replace with a 3A fast blow fuse.



3. Ensure that the silver tip is placed in the black end piece. Screw on the black end piece.
